| Maths & Numeracy | WJEC | <p>The course is split into two separate GCSEs. One GCSE for 'traditional' maths and another GCSE for numeracy. Numeracy focuses on around 60% of the maths course but the problems are in context and usually require some interpretation Internal assessment throughout the course with 3 modular assessments per grade. In Y11 pupils complete a past paper either in class or at home each fortnight. Grade is based entirely on exams taken at the end of Y11.</p> <p>Maths: 1 non-calculator and 1 calculator paper. 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| English Language | WJEC | <p>Oracy, reading and writing skills are developed in pupils' study of English Language. The qualification is comprised of two oracy tasks that equate to 20% of pupils' overall grade, and two written examinations that assess both reading and writing skills. Reading questions require pupils to answer low tariff questions including multiple choice plus longer, extended answers that demonstrate inference, analysis, comparison and synthesis skills.</p> <p>Writing tasks include leaflets, articles, speeches, letters, description, narrative and exposition essays. Internal assessment will take place throughout the year to test specific question types. Targeted feedback will ensure that pupils understand how to improve their performance. Timed examination practice will take place in lessons to develop pupils' resilience and timing to answer all of the questions in each 2-hour exam.
