	<ul> <li>including some that are complex.</li> <li>identify some main points, details and some opinions.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>sometimes respond to questions in French and take part in basic discussions with some spontaneity.</li> </ul>
D	<ul> <li>express simple points of view with short responses in both spoken and written French.</li> </ul>
U	<ul> <li>use more simplified vocabulary and structures and occasionally attempt to include different time frames.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>convey some clear messages with a fair degree of accuracy in pronunciation.</li> </ul>
	• show some understanding of different types of written texts with more basic structures.
	<ul> <li>identify some main points, details and some opinions.</li> <li>write for different purposes and contexts using a more simplified range of vocabulary and</li> </ul>
	structures.
	<ul> <li>convey most of the main points but mistakes in spelling and grammar are evident.</li> </ul>
	An E grade learner in French is able to:
	<ul> <li>show some understanding of straightforward spoken French in shorter extracts that relates to mostly familiar contexts.</li> </ul>
Е	identify some main points and extract some details.
	<ul> <li>occasionally respond to questions in French and take part in simple conversations and express their opinion.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>use a range of simple language, usually in short responses with mostly understandable pronunciation.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>convey main points, despite grammatical inaccuracies.</li> </ul>



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	<ul> <li>show some understanding of short, straightforward written texts that relate to mostly familiar contexts, identifying the main points and extracting some details.</li> <li>occasionally respond to questions in French.</li> <li>write short texts that relate to mostly familiar contexts and express straightforward opinions.</li> <li>use a simple range of vocabulary and structures.</li> <li>convey main points but there are mistakes in spelling and grammar.</li> </ul>
	An F grade learner in French is able to:
F	<ul> <li>show a limited understanding of basic spoken French in shorter extracts that relates to familiar contexts.</li> <li>sometimes identify main points and extract a few details.</li> <li>sometimes take part in simple conversations by responding briefly to familiar questions.</li> <li>use a more limited range of vocabulary and simple grammatical structures.</li> <li>speak with some understandable pronunciation, but lapses, coupled with grammatical inaccuracies, may prevent communication.</li> <li>show limited understanding of short, basic written texts that relate to familiar contexts.</li> <li>occasionally identify main details and information.</li> <li>write brief texts that relate to familiar contexts.</li> <li>express simple opinions but range of vocabulary and structures is limited.</li> <li>sometimes able to convey the main points but there are mistakes in spelling and grammar that at times may prevent communication.</li> </ul>
	A G grade learner in French is able to:
G	<ul> <li>show very limited understanding of basic spoken French in shorter extracts that relates to familiar contexts.</li> <li>occasionally identify main points and details.</li> <li>take part in simple conversations by responding briefly to some questions.</li> <li>use a limited range of vocabulary and grammatical structures, maybe just phrases.</li> <li>use pronunciation that is sometimes understandable, but lapses, coupled with grammatical inaccuracies, may prevent communication.</li> <li>show very limited understanding of short, basic written texts that relate to familiar contexts.</li> <li>can occasionally identify main points and details.</li> <li>write very brief texts that relate to familiar contexts and express simple opinions.</li> <li>use a limited range of vocabulary and structures is limited.</li> <li>sometimes convey main points but there are frequent mistakes in spelling and grammar that may prevent communication.</li> </ul>
