# **Toilet Policy**

We have noted some confusion over our toilet policy and therefore want to ensure all parents/carers are aware of the situation. Students may use the toilets freely before school, at breaktime, lunchtime and after school. Please note that F block toilets are now open before and after school and that this is in response to student requests. During lesson time, students are expected to ask their teacher if they need to use the toilet (as has always been the case). They then go to main reception to sign out a key, use a designated toilet, and return the key. Students with medical issues or particular additional learning needs are entitled to a toilet pass and parents/carers should contact the ALN team or their child's Head of Year if one of these is needed.

Please be rest assured that **all students** are **allowed to use the toilet if they need to,** though we do encourage them to do so at break and lunchtimes rather than during lesson time to ensure maximum learning time and limited disruption to lessons. The only difference between our previous policy and the new one, is that students have to sign out a key to use the toilet in lesson times. I'm delighted to share with you that we have noticed a significant decrease in many of the issues we were experiencing linked to the toilets since the new policy was introduced and we feel the toilets are a much safer and more pleasant environment for all our learners as a result.

If any parent/carer has any particular concerns in this area in relation to their child, please do not hesitate to contact your child's Head of Year.

#### 60th Anniversary Celebrations
